

ALGONQUIN, IL | LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTIVE FUND TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$19,003,224

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Algonquin, our lost revenue totals **\$19,003,244**.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Algonquin, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our residents rely on every day.

- **23%** of our LGDF funding is used for infrastructure maintenance.
- **43%** of our LGDF funding is used for public safety salaries.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up **33%** of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2009 and 2022, the State's total income tax receipts increased by **195%**.



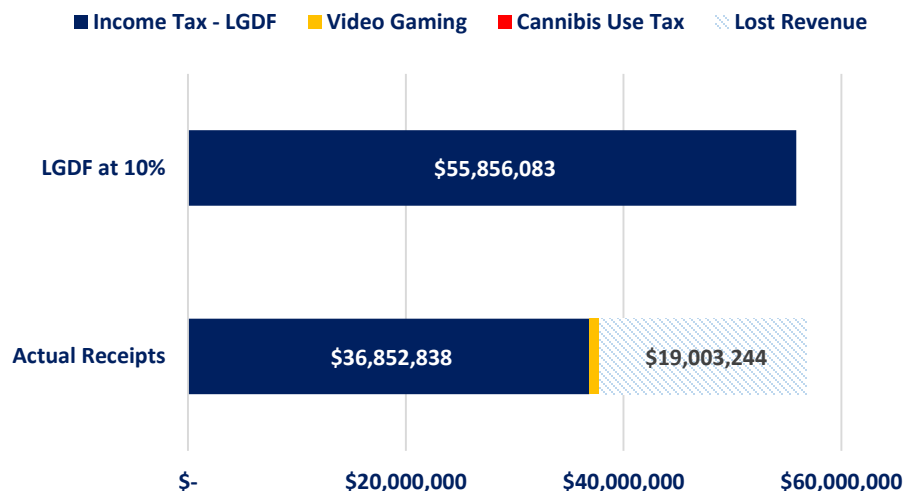
