In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Glendale Heights, our lost revenue totals **\$21,910,007**.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Glendale Heights, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the infrastructure, public safety, and parks services that our residents rely on every day.

- o In Glendale Heights, LGDF is deposited in the General Fund, **30**% of which goes to public safety personnel and operations, and **9**% of which supports public works, administration, and streets and fleet personnel, as well as upkeep and improvements for Village sidewalks, streetlights, signs, and stormwater infrastructure.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up only 14.1% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2011 and 2022, the State's total income tax (IT) receipts increased by 174%.




UNFUNDED PROJECTS

- LGDF represents 14% of the Village's 2022 Operating Budget.
- \$3.25 million will be allocated to public safety pensions in 2023.
- \$105,744 in state administrative collection fees were withheld from the Village in 2022.
