

HARVEY, IL – LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTIVE FUND

TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$16,062,132

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Harvey, our lost revenue totals **\$16,062,132**.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Harvey, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our residents rely on every day.

- **0%** of Harvey’s LGDF funding was invested in capital projects in 2022.
- **4%** of our LGDF funding is used for public safety salaries.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up only **9.8%** of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2009 and 2022, the State’s total income tax receipts increased by **195%**.

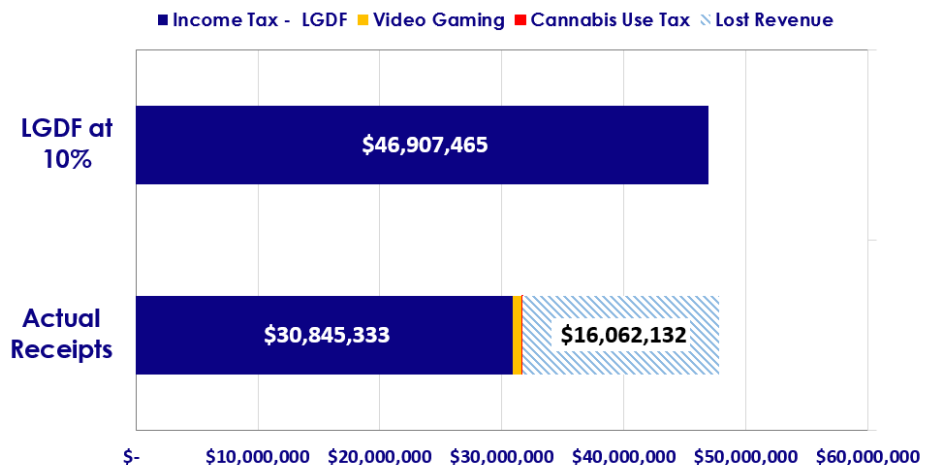

BY THE NUMBERS

- LGDF represents **13%** of our operating budget in 2022.
- **\$5,649,324** annually for public safety pensions (27% of levy in 2021)
- **\$68,040,000** for lead service line replacement.
- **\$80,000/year** for police body camera
