In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Lombard, our lost revenue totals \$28,020,922.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Lombard, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our residents rely on every day.

- o LGDF revenue represents 12% of the Village's General Fund.
- Tough decisions regarding budgetary pressures have resulted in cumulative budget reductions of \$10 million since 2017.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up only 4.2% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2011 and 2022, the State's total income tax (IT) receipts increased by 174%.




TOUGH DECISIONS

- Eliminated 9 full-time & 12 part-time positions.
- Eliminated 3 Village vehicles and the preschool Fire Public Education program.
- Reduced Village services, including curbside brush collection, Pride newsletter, and Taxi Subsidy Program.

KEY FIGURES

- \$5.83 million allocated to public safety pensions in 2022, or 14.7% of the General Fund.
- \$1.36 million for lead service line replacement.
- \$423,284 for a 5-year police body cameras contract, plus \$80,000 annually for administrative costs.
