ARLINGTON HEIGHTS LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTIVE FUND TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$47,626,690

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Arlington Heights, our lost revenue totals **\$47,626,690**.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Arlington Heights, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in services that our residents rely on every day.

- o The General Assembly's limited action of the LGDF will restore only an estimated \$1.6 million over the next decade. A partial restoration could restore \$36.5 million for public safety, infrastructure and other critical priorities.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up only
 2% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2009 and 2022, the State's total income tax receipts increased by 195%.




