BARRINGTON LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTIVE FUND TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$6,535,910

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Barrington, our lost revenue totals \$6,535,910.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Barrington, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in services that our residents rely on every day.

- o The General Assembly's limited action of the LGDF will restore only an estimated \$219,000 over the next decade. A partial restoration could restore \$5 million for public safety, infrastructure and other critical priorities.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up only 2% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2009 and 2022, the State's total income tax receipts increased by 195%.


