TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$11,699,140

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Deerfield, our lost revenue totals \$11,699,140.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Deerfield, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the public safety services that our residents rely on every day.



- 100% of LGDF goes to public safety salaries.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax revenue made up only 2% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels. The Village does not receive any revenue from video gaming.
- Between 2009 and 2022, the State's total income tax receipts increased by 195%.
