HOFFMAN ESTATES LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTIVE FUND TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$32.7 MILLION

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Hoffman Estates, our lost revenue totals \$32.7 million.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Hoffman Estates, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our residents rely on every day.

- o The General Assembly's limited action of the LGDF will restore only an estimated \$26 million over the next decade. A partial restoration could restore \$600 million for public safety, infrastructure and other critical priorities.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up only 13% of the difference between current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2009 and 2022, the State's total income tax receipts increased by 195%.




UNFUNDED PROJECTS

- Parking lot replacements (municipal share) - \$2.7 million.

- LGDF represents 11% of our operating budget.
- \$9.7 million for public safety pensions in most recent fiscal year.
- Over \$600,000 for police body cameras (5-year cost).
