MORTON GROVE LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTIVE FUND TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$14,770,320

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Morton Grove, our lost revenue totals \$14,770,320.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Morton Grove, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our residents rely on every day.

- 50% of LGDF goes to public safety salaries.
- **25**% of LGDF goes to infrastructure investment.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up only 20% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2009 and 2022, the State's total income tax receipts increased by 195%.




