NILES LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTIVE FUND TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$18,887,421

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Niles, our lost revenue totals **\$18,887,421**.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Niles, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our residents rely on every day.

- **21**% of LGDF goes to public safety salaries.
- o 7% of LGDF goes to infrastructure investment.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up only 31% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2009 and 2022, the State's total income tax receipts increased by 195%.




UNFUNDED PROJECTS

- \$14,552,996 for public safety pensions in most recent fiscal year.

- \$720,218 for police body cameras (5-year cost).
