CITY OF NAPERVILLE LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTIVE FUND TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$93,248,906

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Naperville, our lost revenue totals \$93,248,906.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Naperville, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our residents rely on every day.

- The City's allocation of LGDF funding is used to provide general government services, such as police, fire, and public works to our community.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax made up only 1.6% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels. Naperville does not receive video gaming revenue.
- Between 2011 and 2022, the State's total income tax (IT) receipts increased by 174%.




BY THE NUMBERS

- In 2021, LGDF funded
 15% of the City of

- Our total lost LGDF revenue is equivalent to receiving zero LGDF dollars for over 4 years.

KEY FIGURES

- \$18 million for public safety pensions in 2022.
- \$8 million projected to complete lead service line replacement.
- The City allocates
 \$450,000 annually for police body camera expenses.
