
CITY OF PALOS HILLS LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTIVE FUND TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$11,332,564

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Palos Hills, our lost revenue totals \$11,332,564.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Palos Hills, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our residents rely on every day.

- o In Palos Hills, LGDF revenue funds our growing public safety pension obligations, which totaled **\$1.3 million** in FY 2022.
- The City would utilize an increase in LGDF to fund police body camera implementation, our police pension fund, and necessary police vehicle replacements.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up only 16.3% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2011 and 2022, the State's total income tax (IT) receipts increased by 174%.




BY THE NUMBERS

KEY FIGURES

- LGDF represents 21% of our annual operating budget.
- \$1.3 million for public safety pension obligations in FY22.
- \$35,000 annually for police body camera mandate implementation and ongoing maintenance/storage costs.
