In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Roselle, our lost revenue totals \$14,676,589.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Roselle, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our residents rely on every day.

- Our budget is under pressure from the cost of complying with strict state & federal standards for maintaining & replacing wastewater treatment infrastructure.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up only 17.8% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2011 and 2022, the State's total income tax (IT) receipts increased by 174%.




UNFUNDED PROJECTS

Village-wide storm-water projects, such as the Devlin and Seasons 4 drainage basins, currently require \$15 million in improvements.

KEY FIGURES

- LGDF represents 15% of our operating budget.
- \$3 million annually for public safety pensions in 2022.
- \$2.4 million to 3.6 million estimated for lead service line replacement.
- \$42,000 annually for police
 body camera data storage.
