VILLAGE OF SCHAUMBURG LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTIVE FUND TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$48,135,800

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. In Schaumburg, our lost revenue totals \$48,135,800.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC WORKS & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Schaumburg, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in the infrastructure and public works services that our residents rely on every day.

- Not only are the listed infrastructure projects currently unfunded, but they are in most need of repair, with the worst pavement condition index in the Village.
- In 2022, cannabis use tax and video gaming revenue made up only 3.8% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels.
- Between 2011 and 2022, the State's total income tax (IT) receipts increased by 174%.



- LGDF is allocated to the General Fund represents 9% of our operating budget.
- \$11,043,939 allocated in Fiscal Year 2022 for public safety pension obligations.
- \$2,399,000 for police body camera implementation over the first 5 years, not including Village labor costs.
