VILLAGE OF WINFIELD LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTIVE FUND TOTAL LOST REVENUE: \$6,152,647

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, LGDF is still not restored. In Winfield, our lost revenue totals \$6,152,647.

FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY & INFRASTRUCTURE

In Winfield, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue is invested in services that our residents rely on every day.

- o In the Village's FY2023 budget, LGDF revenue will represent the equivalent of only 66% of total public safety salaries, or 60.5% of Village capital projects.
- LGDF represents 18% of our General Fund Operating Budget.
- o In 2022, cannabis use tax revenue made up only 1.6% of the difference between our current and promised LGDF funding levels. Winfield does not receive video gaming revenue.
- Between 2011 and 2022, the State's total income tax (IT) receipts increased by 174%.





- o \$1.6 million to replace the water meter system.
- o \$15 million in contributions toward of a new police station/ municipal center.

- o \$73,860 in projected expenses for police body camera implementation.
- Our total lost LGDF revenue is equivalent to receiving zero LGDF dollars for over 4 years.
