# Village of Algonquin Local Government Distributive Fund Total Lost Revenue: \$29,458,872

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. Our community's lost revenue totals **\$29.5** million to date.

### **Serving Residents & Businesses**

In Algonquin, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue, which is generated from income taxes on our residents & businesses, is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our community relies on every day.

- Increasing LGDF to 6.47% in FY24 invested an additional \$289,756 in our community.
- Our community would lose an estimated \$770,680 each year by eliminating the state sales tax on groceries.
- Replacement of lead service lines will cost \$2.1 million.
- Police body camera implementation costs \$258,000.
- Restoration of LGDF would allow us to fund road improvements in Wecks Subdivision (\$2 million), Janaks Subdivision (\$1.5 million), and Willoughly Farms Park (\$3 million).




#### **Essential Revenue**

- o LGDF represents **19%** of our FY24 General Fund revenues.
- As costs continue to grow, LGDF reduces pressure on property taxes & other revenue.

# **Pension Impacts**

- In 2023, public safety pensions contributions cost \$2.3 million, which is 49% of our FY23 LGDF revenue.
- To date, our total lost LGDF revenue could have funded our contributions to public safety pensions for 13 years.
