City of Batavia Local Government Distributive Fund Total Lost Revenue: \$25,578,304

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. Our community's lost revenue totals **\$25.6 million** to date.

Serving Residents & Businesses

In Batavia, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue, which is generated from income taxes on our residents & businesses, is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our community relies on every day.

- Increasing LGDF to **6.47**% in FY24 invested an additional **\$254,615** in our community, which was used to hire two additional police officers, including a Community Oriented Officer focused on enhancing police-community relations.
- Our community would lose an estimated \$669,705 each year by eliminating the state sales tax on groceries.
- o Replacement of lead service lines will cost \$15 million.
- o Police body camera implementation costs \$125,000.
- Our community received \$152,901 in video gaming revenue in FY23, which was 3.76% of our LGDF revenue.




Essential Revenue

- LGDF represents

- As costs continue to grow, LGDF reduces pressure on property taxes & other revenue.

Pension Impacts

- o In 2023, we paid \$4.2 million in required and additional public safety pension contributions, which is 104% of our FY23 LGDF revenue.
- To date, our total lost LGDF revenue could have funded our contributions to public safety pensions for over
 6 years.
