# City of Geneva Local Government Distributive Fund Total Lost Revenue: \$21,109,812

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. Our community's lost revenue totals **\$21.1 million** to date.

### **Serving Residents & Businesses**

In Geneva, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue, which is generated from income taxes on our residents & businesses, is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our community relies on every day.

- o In 2023 our LGDF revenue, including an additional \$208,712 from the increase to 6.47%, helped to fund vital community investments totaling over \$17.7 million, including a comprehensive plan, Police Department generator, stormwater study, and maintenance for City Hall and Police facilities.
- Our community would lose an estimated \$600,000 each year by eliminating the state sales tax on groceries.
- o Replacement of lead service lines will cost \$43.77 million.
- Police body cameras will cost \$261,501 over 5 years.




#### **Essential Revenue**

# **Pension Impacts**

- In 2023, public safety pensions contributions cost
  \$2.7 million, which is
  49.6% of our municipal property tax levy and 82% of our FY23 LGDF revenue.
- To date, our total lost LGDF revenue could have funded our public safety pension contributions for 7.7 years.
