

Village of North Aurora Local Government Distributive Fund

Total Lost Revenue: \$17,060,692

In 2011, the General Assembly reduced the percentage of income tax revenue that is allocated to local governments, promising that these cuts would be a temporary shared sacrifice. Over a decade later, **LGDF** is still not restored. Our community's lost revenue totals **\$17.1 million** to date.

Serving Residents & Businesses

In North Aurora, Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue, which is generated from income taxes on our residents & businesses, is invested in the infrastructure and public safety services that our community relies on every day.

- The FY24 LGDF increase to **6.47%** invested an additional **\$178,000** in our community. Further restoration could help fund our road program or a new public works facility.
- Our community would lose an estimated **\$669,484** each year by eliminating the state sales tax on groceries.
- Police body camera implementation, including data storage and maintenance will cost **\$273,450** over 5 years.
- In FY23, our community received **\$28,137** in video gaming revenue, which is **5.5%** of our FY23 LGDF revenue.



Essential Revenue

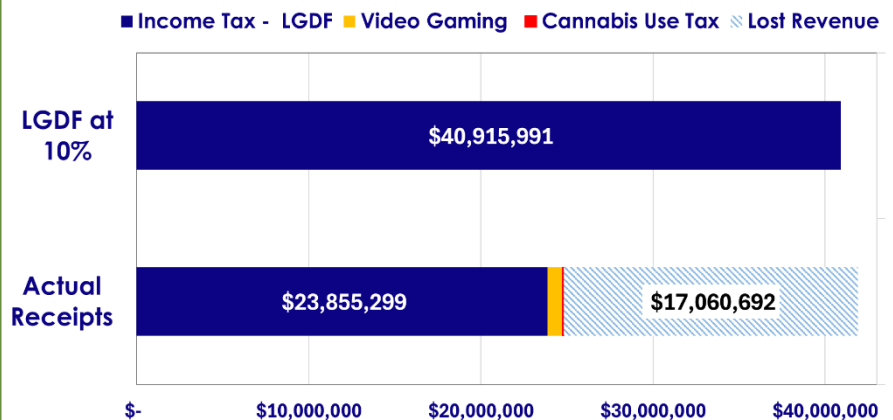
- LGDF represents **19%** of our FY23 general fund revenues.
- As costs continue to grow, LGDF reduces pressure on property taxes & other revenue.

Pension Impacts

- In 2023, public safety pensions contributions cost **\$1.4 million**, which is **60%** of our municipal property tax levy & **51%** of our LGDF revenue.
- To date, our total lost LGDF revenue could have funded our public safety pensions for **11.8 years**.
